Softball hosted Mount Dora Christian. JV tallied 12 hits on the day, winning 11-4. Kylie Omans, Erin Kurth, Bryana Nelson, and Ava Gelm each had multiple hits. Mackenzie Fore pitched the shutout for Varsity in route to a 1-0 win. Angelee Bueno had two doubles, one of which was followed by a RBI double by Ava Bassani to score the only run of the game.
