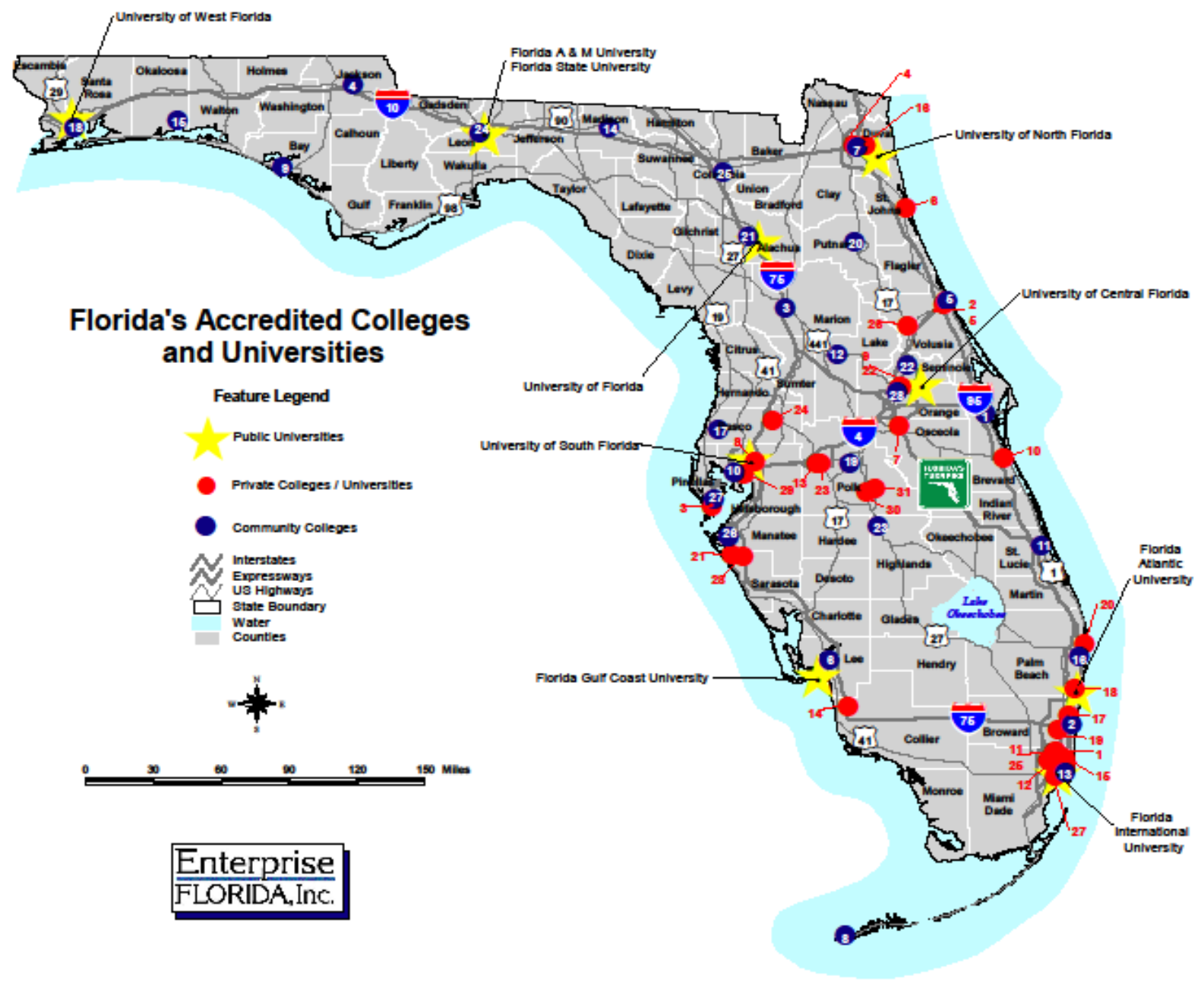
Florida's Accredited Colleges and Universities

Admissions Matrix**

- Where are you going?
 - Choose 3-6 schools ranging from schools that will definitely admit you to dream schools.
- College Visits
 - Best time to visit is during Fall and Spring semesters of the junior year.
- Summer Preparation
 - Essays
 - Letters (students can begin the recommendation letter process as early as junior year)
 - Applications
- NCAA
 - Register with the Clearinghouse for initial eligibility.

Scholarships and Financial Aid

- Academic Scholar Award
 - 3.5 GPA
 - 1290 SAT (Math and Reading ONLY)
 - 29 ACT (Not Including Writing Test)
- Medallion Scholar Award
 - Pays at the Academic Scholar rate at a 2 year school
 - 3.0 GPA
 - 1170 SAT (Math and Reading ONLY)
 - 26 ACT (Not Including Writing Test)
- Gold Seal Vocational Scholar Award
 - May only be used for vocational majors at a community college
 - 3.0 GPA
 - SAT: Reading: 440 Math: 440
 - ACT: Reading: 18 English: 17 Math: 19
 - PERT: Reading 104 Writing: 99 Math: 113

Bright Futures

- Academic Scholar Award
 - 100 hours
- Medallion Scholar Award
 - 75 hours
- Gold Seal Vocational Award
 - 30 hours

Community Service

- Students have four years to complete community service.
- Students must complete one 1 page essay.
- Students may complete the Bright Futures application even if they have not completed community service.

Community Service

- What is PERT?
 - Post-Secondary Educational Readiness Test
 - Areas assessed are:
 - Reading: passing score is 104
 - Writing: passing score is 99
 - Math: passing score is 113
- Who takes the PERT?
 - Juniors who have not shown college readiness through SAT or ACT scores.
- What if I do not pass the PERT?
 - You will need to take college readiness courses in the senior year unless college readiness is shown through an SAT or ACT exam score.

College Readiness/PERT

- National Merit
 - National Merit Scholarships are ONLY available by taking the PSAT in your JUNIOR year.
 - Winners must score in the top half of the top 1%
 - Awards from schools can range from around \$5000 to a full-ride scholarship

Why is the PSAT important?

- SAT

- Offered 7 Times per year

- October, November, December, January, March, May, and June

- Typical Timeframe:

- Seniors take the test in the Fall

- Juniors take the test in the Winter and Spring

- Best times to take the test

- Junior year: January and May

- Senior year: October

- SAT can also substitute for PERT and keep students from taking College Readiness Courses.

SAT Test

- **ACT & Writing Test**
 - Offered 7 Times per year
 - September, October, December, February, April, June, and July
 - Typical Timeframe:
 - Seniors take the test in the Fall
 - Juniors take the test in the Winter and Spring
 - Best times to take the test
 - Junior year: April and June
 - Senior year: October
 - ACT can also substitute for PERT and keep students from taking College Readiness Courses.
