FAQs about the Civics Literacy Exam

Does the Exam count towards my grade in any classes?

No, but it is required for you to pass before you can earn an undergraduate degree from any Florida College System School.

How many questions are on the exam?

Approximately 80 multiple choice questions

What if I'm not in my senior US Government class until second semester?

US Government is not a required course to take this exam. The test is not tied to any particular course or curriculum. It is a general knowledge exam about civics.

What if I am fully dual enrolled and not on campus at all?

Still attend and take the exam as it is a requirement to earn an undergraduate degree from a Florida College System School. You will also want to hear about graduation regalia.

Bowling took home two wins yesterday over Crooms. The Boys won 2271-2107 & the Girls won 1539-1454. On the Boys side, Spencer Wainright had the high game at 225 & high series at 375. For the Girls, Emily Harvey led the way with a 152 high game & 294 high series.

Swimming competed in the Seminole Athletic Conference Championship yesterday and brought home the combined team trophy! The team won the SAC Championships over rival Lake Brantley by scoring over 1900 points to Lake Brantley's 1760. The Boys won 982-762 & the Girls ended up runner-up to Lake Brantley 1011-977. Kaylin Herbet won the overall high point winner of the meet along with Simon Gong as the freshman high point winner. Winners included Carson Powers in the 1-meter diving by scoring 256.05 points. Luca Oliva won the 200 IM with a 1:53.82, Ryan Reynolds took the 100 Fly with a 52.94, Andrew Christensen won the 500 free with a 5:42, Marin Rose was a double winner in the 200 Free 1:54 and the 500 Free 5:05, Kaylin Herbet was also a double winner in the 50 an the 100 Free posting a 23.9 and a 52. Congrats to both the Boys and the Girls Swim & Diving team!

Freshmen Football won over Hagerty 14-0 last night. Brayden Olsson had 1 receiving TD & a kickoff return for a TD. Dalton Hitt had 1 passing TD & Messiah Montgomery had 1 sack.

Last night, Girls Volleyball won over Hagerty at all three levels to close out the regular season. On Saturday, Cross Country competed at the FSU Pre-State Meet and had a great showing! Girls Golf competed in the SAC Championships at Casselberry Country Club yesterday and came away at 4th place. The team was led by Hannah Booth with a 74.

Girls Varsity Volleyball swept University Orange City 25-8, 25-12, 25-16 in the District Quarterfinal yesterday to advance to the Semifinals tonight. The team was led by freshman Olivia Klimis with 6 kills, 7 assists, and 5 aces, freshmen Anna Rose Cathcart with 5 kills, and sophomore Gracie Newell added 3 kills.

Girls Varsity Volleyball fell to Deland last night 25-15, 17-25, 26-28, 19-25 in the District Semifinal. Based on the team's overall ranking, there is a chance that they will make it to the Region Quarterfinal next Wednesday.

Cross Country ran in the SAC Championships at Hagerty and had a great showing! Boys Varsity finished 3rd overall with only 8 points separating 1st & 3rd place. SCPS collaborates with the Seminole Department of Health to conduct contact tracing and determine isolation or quarantine length after positive test or exposure to a COVID positive individual. On September 22nd, the Florida Department of Health issued Emergency Rule 64DER21-15, which outlined quarantine updates for students in the school setting. SCPS has adjusted their guidelines in accordance to these rules to be effective immediately. The most updated student isolation and quarantine protocols are outlined below.

Student Tests Positive for COVID-19 or Displays Symptoms Consistent with COVID-19	Return From Isolation Protocols:
Student must isolate from school until they satisfy one of the Isolation Return Protocols. Student is exposed to COVID-19 individual at school or in the community	Student can return on Day 11 after symptom onset or on Day 11 after positive test date if no fever for 24 hours and symptoms are improving; OR Student can take a COVID-19 diagnostic test (antigen or PCR) and return to school IF they are asymptomatic AND provide negative test results to the school; OR The student receives written permission to return to school from a medical doctor licensed under chapter 458, Florida Statutes or osteopathic physician licensed under chapter 459, Florida
	Statutes or a advanced registered nurse practitioner licensed under chapter 464, Florida Statutes Quarantine Protocols for Asymptomatic Students:
Parents or legal guardians of students who are known to have been in direct contact with an individual who received a positive diagnostic test for COVID-19 may choose either quarantine option.	Parents/guardians can choose to quarantine student for a period of time not to exceed 7 days from last date of contact with the COVID positive individual. <u>OR</u> Parents/guardians can allow the student to attend
Direct contact is defined as any person within 6 feet of a COVID-19 positive individual cumulatively for 15 minutes or more.	school, school sponsored activities, or be on school property so long as the student remains asymptomatic.

If an exposed student develops symptoms during quarantine, they must meet the return to school protocols for symptomatic/COVID positive students.

In addition, anyone currently in quarantine must be allowed to return, if asymptomatic, upon parent request. No testing is required to return back from quarantine.
