Athletics Update from Athletic Director Jen Darty

Cross Country ran at the Winter Springs Invitational at Central Winds Park. The Girls team took second with the following runners in the top 15 – 5th Sophi Johnson, 7th Maya Cabal, 8th Abbie Davis, 13th Leola Broitman, and 14th Ryleigh Holcomb. The Boys team took third behind the following runners in the top 15 – 2nd Sam Austin, 11th Joe Bellamy, 12th Sam Henery, and 13th Ashton Fields.

Girls Volleyball played New Smyrna Beach – JV won 20-25, 25-13, 16-14. JV was led by Kayla Egerton & Jess Barker. Varsity fell in another five-set battle 20-25, 25-18, 25-18, 15-25, 13-15. Lily Cammack & Raven Wroblewski both had 10 kills & Mia Tagye had 19 assists.

Girls Volleyball swept Atlantic in a Varsity double header. In the first match, the team won 25-8, 25-15, 25-20. Kylie Love had 5 aces & 15 assists. In the second match, the team won 25-4, 25-9, 25-14. Gracie Newell had 5 blocks & Caroline Przystup had 10 kills.

Boys Golf competed yesterday in the Winter Springs Invitational at Tusawilla Country Club and took 3rd overall as a team. Josh Stewart won the individual championship with a one over, 73.

Bowling opened up their season vs. Winter Springs yesterday with two wins. The Boys won 2310-1655 led by Brendan Carney with 236 pins & the Girls won 1967-1365 led by Annie Olay with 194 pins.

Yesterday, despite have 5 of the top 8 scores, the Boys Golf team lost by one stroke to Lake Mary but beat Lyman by 22 strokes. For the third straight time, Josh Stewart led all scorers with a two under par, 34!

Girls Volleyball swept Lake Howell last night at all three levels. Freshmen won 25-10, 25-15 and the team was led by Isabelle Shaw, Hannah Hodgson, and Sofiya Rogers. JV won 25-21, 25-

15 and was led by Emme Noteboom, Azelea Martinez & Jade Boozer. Varsity won 25-10, 25-16, 25-20 behind the solid play of Kylie Love with 21 assists & 4 aces.

Girls Golf beat Lyman & Lake Howell and fell to Seminole yesterday. Top golfers for the team were Mya Bremer with a 54, Rachel Whyte with a 63, and Olivia Day with a 66.

Bowling won over Lake Mary by over 600 pins each. The girls high score was Jackie Gonzalez & the boys high score was Brendan Carney.

Boys Golf fell to Spruce Creek by seven strokes yesterday. Josh Stewart shot an even par, 36, and Andrew Letterman shot a season best two over, 38.

Slow-Pitch Softball dropped both games last night. The team fell 15-13 in a 10 inning Texas Tiebreaker vs. Lake Brantley and then 6-2 to Hagerty. Catherine Buckner and Riley Fennell both had home runs.

Freshmen Football won over Winter Springs 28-6.

Girls Volleyball competed against Hagerty last night. The Freshmen team fell 16-25, 26-24, 11-15. The team was led by Caylianna Craig & Sascha Levy. Junior Varsity won 25-22, 23-25, 15-13 led by Taylor Delaney, Mackenzie Cox, and Kylie O'Brien. Varsity swept the Huskies 25-22, 25-20, 25-17. Caroline Przystup led with 13 kills and 27 digs & Raven Wroblewski added 11 kills and 15 digs. Paige Wisneski had 16 assists & Mia Tagye added 15. Lily Andrews had 20 digs.

On Friday, Varsity Football defeated Harmony 56-21.

Girls Varsity Volleyball competed at the Lyman Tournament over the weekend and finished 3rd. The team fell to New Smyrna Beach before defeating Hagerty again on Friday night behind the strong play of sophomore outside hitter Lily Cammack. On Saturday, the team lost to Lake Nona, won over University Orange City, then fell to Lake Nona again.

On Saturday, Swimming competed at the Lake Brantley Invitational – the Boys won with 402 points over rival Seminole who was the next best at 252 & the Girls were runner-up with a 332 to Winter Park who had 379. Individual champions came from Luca Oliva in the 200 IM with a 1:55, Tyler Hanley in the 100 fly with a 49.1, and Kaylin Herbet and the 100 free with a 51.9. The Lions won the 200-medley relay made up of Hanley Boaz Reynolds and Rockaway with a 135. The girls 400-free relay was won by Carlie Rose, Izzy Bishop, Sarabeth Cathcart, and Kaylin Herbet.

On Saturday, Cross Country ran with JV at the Hagerty Invite & with Varsity at the Katie Caples Invitational. At Hagerty, three out of the four girls all ran a personal record. The Varsity Boys at Hagerty took 10th & JV Boys took 6th. At Katie Caples, the Girls took 8th place and the Boys took 12th place. Sam Austin ran a new personal record of 16:36. Overall, out of the 14 girls & 25 boys that ran this weekend, the team had 17 personal record and 14 season bests.

This school year all events in Seminole County are **cashless**. The Seminole County & FHSAA online ticketing provider is GoFan (www.gofan.co). All tickets will be purchased through GoFan and redeemed electronically on your smart phone at the gate. Upon purchasing tickets, please make sure you do NOT validate them prior to entering the gate. There will not be paper tickets available at the gate. All Fall athletic events, with the exception of Varsity Football, at Oviedo High School are currently available for purchase in GoFan through this link: <https://gofan.co/app/school/FL1808>. For our home Varsity Football games, tickets for general admission will go live online on Monday at 8:00am the week of the home Varsity Football game. Please note, all venues are at limited capacity with a set number of tickets. Once tickets are sold out, we cannot admit any more fans into the stadium. Tickets for our away games in Seminole County will also be available in GoFan when released by the opponent. For our away games in Orange County, they are only permitting two spectators per student-athlete and providing an allotment of tickets to each school that will be distributed by the coach.

For all athletic events, masks are required by SCPS. The administration has the authority by FHSAA to stop the game and require everyone to wear a mask and wear one appropriately meaning covering the nose and mouth area. Please refer to the guidelines for further details.

For our home Varsity Football games, priority parking in the front lot will be \$5 with those spaces for sale in GoFan the week of the game. This parking pass is not your entry to the game as a ticket will also need to be purchased. Free parking is available in the lot off of the bus ramp and the back parking lot. All proceeds from the priority parking lot will go to paying for the turf field.
