



## OVIEDO HIGH SCHOOL BEACH VOLLEYBALL 2022 TRYOUT INFORMATION



Dear Prospective Players & Parents,

Thank you for your interest in becoming a part of the Oviedo Beach Volleyball program. We are excited to have you and are looking forward to the 2022 season. The 2022 season marks the first year that Beach Volleyball is an official sport within the FHSAA and will offer a State Championship. At Oviedo, this will be the seventh season that we have offered Beach Volleyball with our participation previously through the Seminole Athletic Conference. In our first six seasons, we have posted an overall program record of 31-6 with three consecutive undefeated seasons and conference championships in 2017, 2018, and 2019.

The Beach Volleyball season runs from Monday, February 7 through the State Finals on Saturday, May 7. The full season calendar is on the second page of this packet which includes all practices and games. We understand that many are involved in another sport or club volleyball – please review this calendar and communicate any conflicts with Coach Darty as well as your additional sport coach or club coach to ensure we can work together to make your participation possible.

Tryouts will begin on Monday, February 7 from 3:00-4:30pm at Lyman High School and continue on Wednesday, February 9 from 3:00-4:30pm at Lyman High School. The beach courts at Lyman are located behind the Pool and Football stadium. We do not have beach courts at Oviedo High School so all tryouts, practices, and games will be held off campus as indicated on the calendar. Players are responsible for their own transportation to all tryouts, practices and games.

To prepare for tryouts, players are highly encouraged to workout and play beach volleyball on their own. Please note, that the beach roster has limited space. In each match, there are 10 players that will compete within the five pairs. We often carry additional players on the roster for pair changes throughout the season but there will be no more than 16 total players carried on the roster. If your daughter is cut from the team, please respect the coaching staff's decision. All tryout sessions and practices are closed to parents. Once teams are picked, practices will begin on Monday, February 14. Please make sure you **bring plenty of water** to all tryouts, practices and games.

Before tryouts, all players must:

- Be **cleared for participation** through [www.athleticclearance.com](http://www.athleticclearance.com). Full directions for athletic clearance are included in this packet. If you do not gain clearance, you will not be able to participate in any open gyms or tryouts. Please make sure you take care of this as soon as possible and keep in mind, just because you were cleared for Indoor Volleyball in the Fall, does not mean that you are cleared for Beach Volleyball in the Spring. Log in and check your status and make sure you have selected or add Beach Volleyball for participation.

Once a player is selected for a team, they are expected to be at all team events following. There will also be a cost to participate to cover your jersey and gear. # CITIZENSHIP STANDARDS FOR PARTICIPATION IN SCHOOL SPONSORED EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES



## SECTION 1. INTRODUCTION AND PURPOSE

### A. Introduction

Participation in a school sponsored extra-curricular activity or sport is a privilege. These activities are important components of our total educational program. Successful participation in school sponsored extra-curricular activities requires a higher level of commitment, energy, and maturity.

It is the goal of Seminole County Public Schools to expect a higher standard of excellence from students involved in these activities. Participating students are representing our schools in our neighborhoods, our communities, our state and often our nation. The standard of behavior should be one that exhibits pride, politeness, and responsibility.

Parents and students should seriously discuss the impact of the extra time, energy, and maturity required to participate in these activities, and the strict eligibility rules a student must follow to remain qualified for such activities.

### B. Purpose

1. To provide minimum citizenship standards among all Seminole County Secondary Schools for continued participation in school sponsored extra-curricular activities.
2. To instill in each student a sense of responsibility to conduct himself/herself as a positive role model.
3. To encourage the growth of good citizenship among participants in school sponsored extra-curricular activities.
4. To delineate the sanctions that will be imposed for violation of this policy.

## SECTION 2. APPLICABILITY

These standards apply to all students participating in School Board approved extra-curricular activities sponsored by the school. Furthermore, these standards apply 24 hours a day for the duration of an activity season. An activity season is considered to be that span of time that commences with the first group/team meeting or tryouts, and runs through any pre-season or regular season practices, competition, or activities, and concludes with any post season or state qualifying play or culminating activity.

## SECTION 3. PROCESSING REPORTS OF VIOLATIONS

Reports of alleged violations of the Citizenship Standards for Participation shall be made to the principal or his/her designee. The principal or his/her designee shall conduct an investigation to determine the validity of any allegations. If it is determined that it is reasonable to believe a violation has occurred, the student and his/her parents shall be notified of the alleged violation, of the possibility of extra-curricular sanctions, and of a right to an informal hearing where evidence may be presented.

A hearing must be requested within seven (7) calendar days of the date of the notification by the principal or his/her designee of the violations. If a hearing is requested, the principal or his/her designee shall conduct one within seven (7) calendar days of receipt of the hearing request. If no hearing is requested, or the hearing request is received after the deadline, the principal or his/her designee shall make a determination whether or not a sanction should be imposed. Hearings shall be conducted in a manner that affords students with a full opportunity to present his/her version of the incident. However, these hearings are not formal legal proceedings and are not required to be conducted in accordance with the rules of procedure normally associated with formal administrative hearings or court proceedings. The decision of the principal is final and is not subject to appeal. If it is determined that a student did commit a violation of the Citizenship Standards Policy the sanctions shall be imposed immediately.

## SECTION 4. SANCTIONS

### A. Suspension from Participation in Events

Students found to have violated the Citizenship Standards Policy shall be suspended from participation in extra-curricular events in accordance with the sanctions outlined in the **Summary Table of Infractions and Consequences**. The sanctions outlined in this policy establish the minimum disciplinary sanction a sponsor or coach shall take in responding to a violation of the Citizenship Standards Policy. Coaches and sponsors have the authority to increase the duration of suspension from participation in extra-curricular events for any violation of this policy.

Students suspended from participation shall not be permitted to participate in any event related activities, dress out for the event, or travel to the event with the team or group. An event is defined as a game, activity, or contest. A tournament experience is considered to be a single event, even though a tournament consists of more than one game, activity, or contest.

When School Board Policy permits, and with permission of the coach or sponsor, students under suspension from participation may participate in tryouts, practices, or meetings while waiting for a sanction to be completed. However, coaches and sponsors may prohibit students from participating in tryouts, practices, or meetings when they deem such action is appropriate.

It is beyond the scope of this policy to identify every possible action on the part of a student that may be deemed as undesirable by a coach or sponsor. Therefore, coaches and sponsors may impose appropriate disciplinary consequences for acts not specifically identified in the **Summary Table of Infractions and Consequences**. Furthermore, nothing in this policy shall prohibit coaches from dismissing or removing a student from a team or group when coaches or sponsors conclude such action is warranted.

## B. Imposing Sanctions

Sanctions shall remain in effect until they are completed. This may require sanctions assigned as a consequence for a violation of the Citizenship Standards Policy be completed during an activity season that is different from the activity that was in effect when the violation occurred. When necessary, the balance of any unfulfilled sanction shall be completed in the following school year in which the student is enrolled.

Students may be given the opportunity to reduce up to one-half the number of events they are to be suspended from for a **first time tobacco violation** of the Citizenship Standards Policy. Students are eligible for this consideration only if they document to the principal completion of a tobacco or smoking cessation class or a tobacco education class that is approved by the Seminole County Public School Safe and Drug Free Schools Committee.

Students may be given the opportunity to reduce up to one half (1/2) the number of events they are to be suspended from for a **first time drug or alcohol related violation** of the Citizenship Standards Policy. Students are eligible for this consideration only if they comply with the principal's requirements for a drug/alcohol assessment from a licensed drug/alcohol counselor and they follow any recommendations made by the counselor.

## Citizenship Standards for Participation: Summary Table of Infractions and Consequences

### ON CAMPUS VIOLATIONS

**LEVEL 1 - IN-SCHOOL SUSPENSION** - If a student is assigned **In-School Suspension**, then the student shall be suspended from a number of events ranging from:

**1 Event to 10 Events**

**LEVEL 2 - OUT-OF-SCHOOL SUSPENSION** - If a student is assigned **Out-of-School Suspension**, then the student shall be suspended from a number of events ranging from:

**10% of Events to all Events (minimum of 2)**

**LEVEL 3 - RETURN TO ZONED SCHOOL UNDER THE CONDITIONS OF A WAIVER and DISTRICT BEHAVIOR CONTRACT** - If a student is allowed to return to a zoned school under conditions of a **Waiver and District Behavior Contract** as an alternative to expulsion, then the student shall be suspended from a number of events ranging from:

**50% of Events to All Events for 1 Calendar Year**

**LEVEL 4 - ALTERNATIVE PLACEMENT UNDER THE CONDITIONS OF A WAIVER and DISTRICT BEHAVIOR CONTRACT** - If a student is allowed to attend the district alternative school or another Alternative Educational Assignment as an alternative to expulsion, then the student shall be suspended from a number of events ranging from:

**All Events for the Duration of Placement to All Events for the Duration of the Student's Enrollment in the Seminole County Public Schools**

**LEVEL 5 - EXPULSION** - If a student is **expelled** from all Seminole County Public Schools, then the student shall be suspended from a number of events ranging from:

**All Events for 1 Calendar Year and/or the extent of the expulsion to All Events for the Duration of the Student's Enrollment in the Seminole County Public Schools**

### OFF CAMPUS VIOLATIONS

**LEVEL 1 - FALSE IDENTIFICATION or TOBACCO PRODUCT USE** - If a student is found to have possessed or used **False Identification**, or possessed or used **Tobacco Products**, then the student shall be suspended from a number of events ranging from:

**2 Events to All Events for 1 Calendar Year**

**LEVEL 2 - DRUG/ALCOHOL VIOLATION** - If a student is found to have possessed, used, or been under the influence of **Drugs, Alcohol, Controlled Substances, Intoxicants, Substances Capable of Modifying Mood or Behavior, or Prescription Medication** without a physician's prescription, then the student shall be suspended from a number of events ranging from:

**20% of Events to All Events for 1 Calendar Year**

**LEVEL 3 - ARREST BY LAW ENFORCEMENT** - If a student is **Arrested** for committing an off campus misdemeanor or delinquent act, then the student shall be suspended from a number of events ranging from:

**0 to All Events Pending School Administrative Review**

**LEVEL 4 - ARREST BY LAW ENFORCEMENT** - If a student is **Arrested** for committing an off campus felony, then the student shall be suspended from a number of events ranging from:

**50% of Events to All Events for the Duration of the Student's Enrollment in the Seminole County Public Schools**

**LEVEL 5 - FORMAL CHARGES FILED** - If a student is **Formally Charged** with committing an off campus felony, misdemeanor, or a delinquent act, then the student shall be suspended from a number of events ranging from:

**All Events for 1 Calendar Year to All Events for the Duration of the Student's Enrollment in the Seminole County Public Schools**

**LEVEL 6 - CHARGES CONFIRMED** - If a student is found by a court of competent jurisdiction to have committed an off campus felony, misdemeanor, or a delinquent act, then the student shall be suspended from a number of events ranging from:

**All Events for 1 Calendar Year to all events for the duration of the Student's Enrollment in the Seminole County Public Schools**

## ATHLETIC CLEARANCE & ONLINE SPORTS PHYSICAL SUBMISSION INFORMATION



### **Documents Needed:**

### **Physical, Insurance Card, Parent Driver's License, Birth Certificate, FHSAA Course Certificates**

1. Visit [www.AthleticClearance.com](http://www.AthleticClearance.com) and select Florida.
2. **Login** using your email address and password that you registered with last year or **register** and complete the seven fields including a security question. You must use a valid email username and password as this email is where you will receive updates on your clearance status.
3. Select **"Start Clearance Here"**.
4. Select **"2021-2022"**, select **"Oviedo High School"**, Select **"Beach Volleyball"**. If you intend on participating in other sports, you will have the option to select those later.
5. Complete all required fields for:
  - a. Student Information – You must use legal name as appears in Skyward.
  - b. **Student Uploads:**
    - i. **FHSAA/SCPS EL2 Sports Physical** – You must have a physical completed on this specific form. Your physical is valid for 365 days from your date of examination. Before you upload, double check that you have student and parent signature's at the bottom of the first page of the physical and that the date of the exam is clearly written on the second page of the physical.
    - ii. **Birth Certificate**
    - iii. **Health Insurance Card** – you must have health insurance to participate in high school athletics
    - iv. **Parent Driver's License** – needed to confirm parent consent
    - v. **FHSAA Required Video Certificates** – all student-athletes are required to watch three NFHS courses, directions to access can be found on the last page of this packet
  - c. **Medical History** – answer all questions and provide necessary information
  - d. **Electronic Signatures** – students & parents must sign each slot for the EL3 Forms & SCPS Citizenship Policy
6. Optional Donation to your athletic program.
7. Once you reach the **Confirmation Message** you have completed the process.
8. If you would like to register for additional sports you may check off those sports below the Confirmation Message. Electronic signatures will be applied to the additional sports/activities.
9. All of this data will be electronically filed with your school's Athletic Department for **review**. When the student has been **cleared for participation**, an email notification stating clearance will be sent and the coach will also be notified. If you did not complete all of the necessary requirements, you will receive a denial email with what is missing from your file. This will get reviewed again and is not final as long as missing items get completed.

**Note:** You cannot participate until you have been cleared through this process.  
You must also maintain a cumulative unweighted 2.0 GPA to be academically eligible.

# FHSAA REQUIRED STUDENT-ATHLETE COURSES



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FHSAA Policy requires that all student-athletes complete three courses through the National Federation of State High School Associations website. These courses must be taken & renewed each school year.

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## Courses you must complete:

1. Concussion in Sports (FHSAA Policy 40)
2. Heat Illness Prevention (FHSAA Policy 41)
3. Sudden Cardiac Arrest (FHSAA Policy 42)

## To complete the courses:

*Step 1:* Go to [www.nfhslearn.com](http://www.nfhslearn.com).

*Step 2:* “**Sign In**” to your account using the e-mail address and password you provided at time of registering for an nfhslearn account. If you do not have an account, “**Register**” for an account.

*Step 3:* Click “**Courses**” at the top of the page.

*Step 4:* Either scroll down to the title of the course from the list of courses or search for the name of the course.

*Step 5:* Click “**View Course**”.

*Step 6:* Click “**Order Course**.”

*Step 7:* Select “**Myself**” if the course will be completed by you.

*Step 8:* Click “**Continue**” and follow the on-screen prompts to finish the checkout process. (Note: There is no fee for this course.)

*Step 9:* Click “**Begin Course**” on the course you wish to take.

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**When you have completed these courses, upload the certificates into your account on [www.AthleticClearance.com](http://www.AthleticClearance.com)**
