Graduation Requirements (26 Credits)

- 4 credits of English (English 1, 2, 3, 4)
- 4 credits of Math (Must be earned 9-12 gr. Including: Alg 1, Geom)
- 4 credits of Science (with a lab component, must have Biology)
- 3 credits of Social Studies (World History, US History, Govt/Econ)
- 1 credit of PE (Substitutions on Page 42 of SPP 0.5 credit must be Personal Fitness)
- 1 Fine Arts or Practical Arts credit
- 0.5 credits of Personal Financial Literacy w/ Money Management (c/o 2027 & 2028)
- 8.5 additional elective credits
- ** College bound students should take 2 years of the same world language.

Other Graduation Requirements

• 2.0 Grade Point Average on a 4.0 scale

• Pass the 10th Grade FSA/FAST ELA with a level 3 or higher

• Pass the Algebra or Geometry EOC with a level 3 or higher

- Participate in all EOCs (Algebra/Geometry/Biology/US History)
 - EOCs also count for 30% of Final Grades

- AP credits are 1 year.
- Dual Enrollment are ½ a year.

What to Watch For

- Pre-Requisites!
 - Studio Art 2-D and Studio Art 3-D requires 2-D Art and 3-D Art
 - Math and Science courses have several pre/co-Requisites
- Double check if courses are Semester (0.5 Credits) or Year-Long (1.0 Credits)
- Make sure you don't already have credit in the course
- Course Request Deadline is February 9th, 2024
- 8th Grade Course Requests

FAQs Middle School Courses

- Details on the SPP pages 36-37
- High School credit math courses count as elective credits
- Students who earn a "C", "D", or "F" can retake the same or comparable course and replace the grade with a "C" or higher earned in the replacement course.
- Course history will remain on the transcript, but the GPA calculation will only use the replacement grade.
